Understanding the step to write your paper, read briefly over the following and check as you go along to help you complete your research paper.

1. Understand the assignment

Completing a research paper effectively means accomplishing the specific tasks set out for you. Before you start, make sure you thoroughly understand the assignment task sheet:

- Identify the assignment goal, deadline, length specifications.
 - *Your goal is to write a paper on one of the topics above and be aware of the time set to complete this task.*
- Make a bulleted list of the critical points, then go back and cross completed items off as you're writing.

2. Choose a research paper topic

There are many ways to generate an idea for a research paper, from brainstorming with pen and paper to talking it through with a fellow student or teacher. *The presentation will have highlighted an area in your mind as your topic*

You can try freewriting, which involves taking a broad topic and writing continuously for two or three minutes to identify absolutely anything relevant that could be interesting.

3. Conduct preliminary research

Note any discussions that seem essential to the topic, and try to find an issue to focus your paper around. Use various online sources, including journals, books and reliable websites, to ensure you do not miss anything glaring.

- Are there any heated debates you can address?

- Do you have a unique take on your topic?
- Have some recent developments build on the extant research?

4. Write the introduction

The research paper introduction should address three questions: What, why, and how? After finishing the introduction, the reader should know what the paper is about, why it is worth reading, and how you'll build your arguments.

What? Be specific about the paper's topic, introduce the background, and define key terms or concepts.

Why? This is the most important, but also the most difficult, part of the introduction. Try to provide brief answers to the following question: What essential issues does your essay help define or answer?

How? Let the reader know what to expect from the rest of the paper. The introduction should include a "map" of what will be discussed, briefly presenting the paper's critical elements in chronological order.

5. Write a compelling body of text

Most writers' major struggle is how to organize the information presented in the paper, which is one reason an outline is so helpful. However, remember that the outline is only a guide and, when writing, you can be flexible with the order in which the information and arguments you presented.

Aim to create smooth transitions between sentences, paragraphs, and sections.

6. Write the conclusion

The conclusion is designed to give them a sense of finality.

Give the paper a sense of finality by making sure the reader understands how you've settled the issues raised in the introduction.

Important: This is an overview of your research paper, so the important thing is to relax and enjoy. Find a topic which you find exciting and complete the three main areas.
